



# You are invited to join the Boulevard Neighborhood Association (BNA)

The Boulevard Neighborhood consists of approximately 600 homes, most dating to the late 19th and early 20th centuries. These 150 acres of rolling terrain feature stately Neoclassical and Greek Revival homes, Victorian cottages, Craftsman-style bungalows, and mill houses and shotgun shacks, as well as a number of brand-new homes in styles which complement the historic architecture of the neighborhood.

Characterized by the wide tree-lined boulevard, down which a streetcar line ran through the early decades of the last century, the Boulevard Neighborhood is bounded by Pulaski Street in the east to Pound Street in the west and Prince Avenue in the south to the CSX rail line in the north. Portions of the neighborhood are designated Federal or Local Historic Districts.

Founded in the 1980s, the Boulevard Neighborhood Association seeks to enhance the character of the area as a desirable downtown neighborhood; to maintain the integrity, aesthetics, and predominately residential character of the area and its historic structures; to protect the environment and natural features of the area; to encourage persons to buy, restore, and improve homes in the area; to prevent intrusions which are destructive to the character of the area; and to promote neighborliness.

The BNA serves as an advocacy group in protecting residential property from commercial development, speaks out on issues such as safety, traffic, and quality-of-life ordinances, and organizes neighborhood-improvement and social activities and is an active supporter of Chase Street Elementary School. Newsletters are distributed to all households several times a year.
